

Fine Arts Boosters Minutes
September 16, 2019

The meeting was called to order in the high school library at 6:30 p.m. by Laurel Swanson, president.

Welcome and Introductions – Members introduced themselves.

Minutes from August – Members reviewed copies of the August board meeting. Darla Davidson made a motion to approve the minutes; Kelly Daniel seconded. Motion passed.

Financial Reports and Updates – Rachelle Lorentzen, treasurer, presented the financial reports. There is currently \$17,510.02 in the FAB Accounts and \$29,491.94 in the Foundation accounts. Darla Davidson made a motion to approve the financial reports; Courtney Morris seconded. Motion passed.

Representative/Teacher Reports

Art – Darla Davidson reported student-designed art shirts are available for purchase. Funds raised from the shirts cover the cost of art contest fees. No new update on carts for the art shows.

Band – Braden Wipperman reported that the first football performance went well in the new uniforms. The tubs approved at the August meeting were purchased for the gauntlets. Wipperman provided a receipt to Lorentzen. The band will participate in the first competitive circuit beginning September 28. Parent chaperones are needed. An email will be sent to parents to contribute for band snacks at competitions.

Choir – Coren Hucke reported that the Raccoon River Conference Honor Choir is scheduled at Bondurant for Tuesday, October 29. The admission cost of \$6 goes to the conference. It is believed Ryan Sweeney through the Activities funds will supply the staff to manage the admission booth. The conference pays the fees for the guest director and accompanist. Two meals will be provided by Bondurant-Farrar. Hucke is checking with Dave Walker if lunch can be provided through the cafeteria at the end of the regularly-scheduled lunch time. Jimmy Johns provides a discount for catering through the school and is being investigated for supper. Volunteers are needed to assist with serving food and program distribution. Denise Fick, Lorentzen and Laurel Swanson volunteered to server dinner and Morris and Davidson volunteered for program distribution.

Drama – Rachelle Lorentzen noted that approximately 20-30 students are involved with the fall play which includes 10 vignettes. The fall play is The Good Doctor by Neil Simon.
