OVERNIGHT STUDENT TRIP RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. School-sponsored trips are designed to be educational in nature and supervised by staff members according to school district standards.
- 2. The request for a school-sponsored trip needs to be made prior to any meeting regarding fund raising.
- 3. A school-sponsored trip itinerary must be presented to the Board for approval.
- 4. All students going on a school-sponsored trip must be in good standing with the school.
- 5. Students must display satisfactory behavior and attendance to qualify for a school-sponsored trip. Conduct that could prevent a student from attending a school-sponsored trip includes, but is not limited to:
 - a. Habitual skipping of class;
 - b. Habitual tardiness;
 - c. Inability of the student to get along with more than one teacher during the year;
 - d. Disruptive behavior;
 - e. A suspension from;
 - f. Other disciplinary matters.
- 6. Students who fail to meet the established standards will not be eligible to participate in a school-sponsored trip. The standards will be set by a trip committee.
- 7. Parents/guardians must attend an informational trip meeting in order for their student to participate in a school-sponsored trip.
- 8. All students will abide by the Good Conduct Rule and all other school rules while on any school-sponsored trip. Students who represent the school in any extracurricular activity can be declared ineligible or temporarily ineligible by the school principal or his/her designee for violations of the Good Conduct Rule (Board Policy 503.4).
- 9. No student is to use or have in his/her possession any alcohol, drugs or drug paraphernalia, tobacco, inhalants, weapons, dangerous objects, or Look-a-likes while on a school-sponsored trip. Student possession is defined as including luggage and personal belongings. Any student who violates these rules may be sent home with a chaperone at the first opportunity available. The expenses of both the student and the chaperone will be the responsibility of the student and his/her parents/guardians.
- 10. All baggage should be checked by parents/guardians at the time of student departure for a school-sponsored trip.
- 11. If alcohol, drugs or drug paraphernalia, tobacco, inhalants, weapons, dangerous objects, look-a-likes are found in a room, and the adult chaperones cannot determine to whom those items belong, all students assigned to that room may be sent home with a chaperone. The expenses of both the student and the chaperone will be the responsibility of the student and his/her parents/guardians. The students in that room must be responsible for each other's behavior.

- 12. Students may be sent home with a chaperone at any time if they participate in any behavior deemed inappropriate by the chaperones. Any student who violates any rules may be sent home with a chaperone at the first opportunity. The expenses of both the student and the chaperone will be the responsibility of the student and his/her parents/guardians.
- 13. Chaperones have the right to check rooms, baggage or personal belongings at any time during a school-sponsored trip if there is reason to believe that a student may possess alcohol, drugs or drug paraphernalia, inhalants, tobacco, weapons, dangerous objects, look-a-likes or if a student is conducting him/herself in an inappropriate manner.
- 14. No gambling will be allowed at any time.
- 15. No students are to be in rooms occupied by the opposite sex unless the door is left open.
- 16. No student is to leave the hotel/motel at night unless accompanied by a chaperone.
- 17. No student(s) will be allowed to remain at the hotel/motel while the rest of the group is attending a function unless due to injury, illness or other unforeseeable problems occur. One of the chaperones will remain with him/her.
- 18. Tours/Group Activities: All students are to go on and participate in all activities.
- 19. All students must be in their assigned rooms after curfew unless approved by a chaperone to be somewhere else. Students are not to leave their rooms after bed check in the evening. The curfew is determined by the chaperones.
- 20. If any student is found guilty of shoplifting or any other violations of the law while on a school-sponsored trip, his/her parents/guardians will be notified, and it will be the parents/guardians' responsibility to travel to said destination or to make arrangements for the student to return home with a chaperone. The expenses of both the student and the chaperone will be the responsibility of the student and his/her parents/guardians. The chaperones will contact the principal or superintendent to inform him/her of such a problem.
- 21. The above rules and regulations will be incorporated into the information presented to students and parents/guardians at the informational meeting.
